## Appendix A:

## Weighted Probability Frequencies

Frequency tables show response distribution across the full range of response options for each question. In these tables, the "Frequency" column shows the number of respondents who selected the corresponding answer. The "Percent" column reflects the percentage of respondents who selected each answer category among the total number of respondents. This includes missing responses—both non-substantive answer categories that have been designated as missing (e.g., "Don't know", "Not sure," "Prefer not to say") as well as system missing (i.e., blank responses). The "Valid Percent" column reflects the percentage of respondents who selected each answer category among the total number of respondents who provided a substantive answer to the question. In other words, the valid percent calculation excludes missing cases from the denominator. Unless otherwise noted, percentages presented in the narrative report reflect the valid percentages.

The data presented in these tables are based on responses from the probability sample only. The data have been weighted with base weights and post-stratification weights.

## Weighted Probability and Nonprobability Cross-tabulations

Cross-tabulation tables count survey cases in categories defined by two variables simultaneously. These cross-tabulation tables allow the reader to compare the responses of different groups. This appendix compares all survey questions by the sample type: either probability or non-probability.

In these tables, the percentages reflect the percent within each sample type that selected the corresponding answer. For example, 97.4% of respondents from the non-probability sample have heard of RCC, compared to 95.5% of respondents from the probability sample.

The probability data presented in these tables have been weighted with base weights and post-stratification weights. The non-probability data are unweighted.

## **Appendix C:**

## Weighted Probability Cross-tabulations by Select Demographics

Cross-tabulation tables count survey cases in categories defined by two variables simultaneously. For example, how many respondents aged 18-29 have heard of RCC? These cross-tabulation tables allow the reader to compare the responses of different demographic groups. This appendix compares the survey questions by age, zip code, homeownership status, length of residence in Reston, and the presence of children in the home.

In these tables, the percentages reflect percent within each demographic affiliation that selected the corresponding answer. For example, 86.8% of respondents aged 18-29 have heard of RCC. In contrast, 97.4% of respondents aged 65 and older have heard of RCC. When the difference between groups for a given variable is statistically significant (p <.05), those rows are formatted in bold.

When reading these tables, it is important to note the distinction between blank cells and cells with "0" counts. The weighted n in some cells in the table can be less than 1. When a "0" count is shown, that indicates the weighted n has been rounded down to zero. When a cell is blank, there are no cases at all in that cell. The "w%" column indicates the weighted percentage of respondents who answered a particular way, within categories displayed across the top of the table.

The data presented in these tables are based on responses from the probability sample only. The data have been weighted with base weights and post-stratification weights.

## **Appendix D:**

# Weighted Probability Means Comparisons across Demographics

In the following tables, a mean rating with a superscript indicates that the mean is a statistically significantly higher numerical value (at the 95% level of confidence) than the mean in the column that is numbered corresponding to the superscript. In instances where a superscript is not present between a pair of groups, the difference between means is not statistically significant.

In the following example, the mean rating of familiarity with RCC programs is compared across grouping of length of residence in Reston. The numbers in the superscript next to the mean indicate the columns than which the mean is statistically significantly higher. As indicated in Column 4, the mean level of familiarity among residents who have lived in Reston for more than 25 years is 3.20, which is statistically higher than the mean rating provided by all other residents. As seen in Column 3, residents who have lived in Reston between 10 and 24 years report a statistically higher mean of familiarity with RCC than do residents who have lived in Reston less than 5 years (Column 1). In other words, residents who have lived in Reston longer report greater familiarity with RCC programs as compared to residents who have lived in Reston for less time.

RCC doesn't need a 2nd facility. Most RCC programs and facilities are redundant with RA and FFX County Rec centers and classes. Also FFX County schools offer ACE classes and sports facilities as does the private sector. Arts and cultural experiences - i.e. Wolftrap, Kennedy Ctr., Smithsonian, Cap. One theater also opened in Tysons.

The cost of RCC in the home owners' assessment is not fair. It is an extravagance that does not serve home owners' purposes. If RCC was so important, its programming should pay for itself.

The current indoor pool will soon be inadequate to serve the recent demographics of the Reston area. Recommend a larger athletic/sports/competition area for basketball, track, 50 meter pool with movable bulkheads, etc.

The DC metro area offer enough progs. I do not think another facility is needed

The density and increased expense along the silver line is making Reston less attractive for families. We should counter that trend with amenities specific for recreation for families with safety in mind. Vagrant services should be provided away from children and seniors.

The facility should be ADA compliant, run on renewable energy, and have a nice warm ambiance that makes people want to hang out there

The fact that ceramics classes are going to lottery registration is awful. Most participants have so many factors involved in registration that this lottery increases the frustration to the point that you just give up. I did.

The Fairfax plan for new center has been talked about but doesn't seem to come to fruition.

The future facility should incorporate the public library. Conceptually speaking, a multi-story building should include multi-uses, perhaps even affordable housing in the top levels. Reston Association offices should also be located in this building.

The great thing about Reston is the diversity of housing. With the silver line and growing density, RCC can help be attractive to apartment, condo, and townhouse dwellers with shared spaces like rental rooms, pavilions, maker spaces, etc. I'm not a developer, but this would be attractive to them as well.

The growth of the cyber world and its grip on everyone, especially the young is a sobering challenge. To be well versed in this technology is essential but it should not be all consuming - as it is. Al will make it more difficult to develop other interests.

The Lake Anne Facility has a large clean bathroom that is very convenient. I frequently walk around the Lake and it is great for me and my family to have an available bathroom.

The main deterrent keeping me from participating is the unwelcoming nature of the spaces. Other than the theater, the spaces are not warm and inviting. I'd rather pay more and go to a nicer venue. Also, parking at RCC Hunters Woods is inconvenient, especially in bad weather.

The needs of the less privileged are first priority

The new space should have ample free parking. Do not put it where a developer will require there be paid parking (like at Town Center).

The Reston community should be less concerned abou what to do for fun and instead address the real issues of real people who live in Reston who's area is ravaged by problems caused by the homeless population Reston has enabled!

There is a lack of awareness of what the RCC is and what it offers in comparison to Fairfax County's rec centers. Some of the functions seem to be duplicated and overlap with the County rec centers. Not sure why the effort couldn't be put to join forces with the County rec centers rather than duplicating functions. Why are Reston residents paying for this extra facility which is difficult to use? If it offered a significant benefit, such as a robust selection of classes (arts, fitness, cultural etc) that were offered at convenient times, I would be happy to pay my RCC dues. I have been intending to use the pool with reserved lane times, but haven't got around to it yet. My Reston Association pool close by was a major disappointment this summer. They deleted swimming lanes during fitness swim and the remaining lanes were so overcrowded that I didn't use this past summer. I tried a few times and it too frustrating.

I have been impressed with the arts programming however. It is nice to have a place to go to performances close by at reasonable prices for artists such as Judy Collins.

There was no mention of our priority! We have large population of "new Americans" and marginalized populations (poor and Black, Latino, etc.) this whole survey maintains the existing racism, xenophobia, and classism.

Think of public - community demograpics & needs

Think of the future trends in tech as well as the possible population increase.

This survey is flawed because there is no option to indicate that we do not support a second RCC facility

with changing (shrinking) population in Fairfax County it is hard to see the need for additional facilities, especially given the large number of comparable commercial and public facilities available.

To make families and autistic youth more comfortable there should be a covered area with some sensory stuff

Try to keep as many trees as possible and build around the natural habitat. Possibly near a pool or lake or golf course or an existing shopping center.

We (husband, wife and child) are 4-year residents. We have never had time for any of the RCC services, or when we went to sign up they were expensive.

We already have the RCC, a YMCA, yoga studios, and fitness centers. Why does Reston need another wellness center? The wellness center in Fairfax County will surely charge more for users. I'll stick with RCC; as a senior resident the cost suits me just fine.

We already pay too much in taxes, Cost should be incurred by the users, or developers we are so involved with 3 kids and spouses(all pushing 60) 8 grandkids and one great grandchild, we really don't have the time for anything else!! have been in same house in hunters woods for 50 years and used to take advantage of what was offered by RCC but now not needed, but think it is important for new residents and younger people..

We do not need a large arts facility. It would be great to have space to teach life skills/workforce skills courses. to that end a teaching kitchen would be amazing.

We don't need a second facility. The RCC should be funded by Fairfax County or closed down. The Small District 5 tax contributes to inequality by reducing housing affordability. It's an inequitable tax given nearly all county community centers are funded without leving (sic) a special tax surcharge. Also, the RCC has outlived its usefulness. When it was founded there were few options available for the types of services it provides. That's no longer true, and given its cost, it has become a burden on the taxpayers.

We love living in Reston and RCC has been fun and usefu; over the years. (happy face) stay at Lake Anne!

We value living in a community with safe, clean, public spaces that are accessible at no or low cost. Please consider adding plenty of parking for bikes and cars, strorage lockers, water bottle refill stations, composting bins, and a room for nursing parents.

We're missing a lot of "third spaces" in America that the community feels connected to and can socialize at. Making known scheduled community-centric events could help establish this further in our community.

What about equity issues - other communities receive an array of recreational services from the county without the need for a small tax district. Check demographic trends: we are aging in place; inflation is high; birth rate is declining.

**Appendix H: Methodology** 

#### **About the Survey**

The Reston Community Center (RCC) contracted the Center for Survey Research (CSR) to conduct the 2024 Reston Community Center Survey. The survey aimed to assess awareness and support for RCC, understand current and projected program use, identify barriers to RCC participation, explore preferences for a second RCC facility, and determine accessible sources of information on leisure activities.

Survey responses were collected through both mail and online methods, using probability and non-probability samples. The probability-based address sample (ABS) represents all households in Reston. ABS participants were first contacted via postal mail with a paper questionnaire and received a delayed invitation to complete the survey online. This sample provides the basis for statistical inference about the Reston population. To ensure broad community participation, non-probability methods were also used. An open-access online version of the survey was posted on RCC's website, allowing any individual connected to the Reston community to participate.

#### **Survey Development**

On February 12, 2024, CSR presented at an RCC Community Relations & Program/Policy Meeting to provide an overview of the 2019 survey design, offer recommendations for 2024 administration, and listen to community feedback on priorities for a second facility. On March 11, 2024, CSR returned to RCC to present a detailed survey proposal to the RCC Board of Governors. This proposal advocated for a mixed-probability, dual-mode survey design of paper and web, similar to the 2019 administration.

#### **Questionnaire Design**

Together, CSR, Leila Gordon, Executive Director of RCC, and Bebe Nguyen, Deputy Director of RCC, reviewed and revised the 2019 questionnaire to update for 2024 administration. Key changes included shortening the instrument, removing questions about a performing arts center, adding questions about priorities for a second RCC facility, and expanding the conditional requirements for select questions to include respondents who had not previously heard of or used RCC programs and facilities.

The final questionnaire was formatted for paper and programmed online in Qualtrics. The questionnaire was available online in English and Spanish, and was available on paper in English, Spanish, Chinese, Russian, and Arabic. A full copy of the paper questionnaire can be found in Appendix G.

#### Sampling

The survey used both probability and non-probability recruitment methods. The non-probability version was open to any adult interested in providing feedback, regardless of residency in Reston. This open-access approach was important as RCC serves not only

Reston residents but also individuals who work in Reston. Additionally, it allowed Reston residents not selected in the probability sample to participate. The probability sampling method is described in detail below.

#### **Probability Sample**

The population of interest for the probability sample was Reston residents. To reach this population, CSR purchased an address-based sample of residential addresses from Dynata, Inc., a nationally recognized vendor for scientific survey samples. The sample is based on the address lists compiled and maintained by the U.S. Postal Service. The sample excluded addresses listed by the post office as businesses, vacant or seasonal homes, and P.O. Box addresses. The sampling vendor appended names of household occupants to the addresses where those were known, using data from white pages telephone directories and other sources.

In an effort to maximize the number of completes from all areas of Reston, the sample was stratified based on the Census Bureau's Low Response Score (LRS) of Census tracts into five stratum: Very low response propensity, moderately low response propensity, average response propensity, above average response propensity, and very high response propensity. Households in the low and very low response propensity stratum were then sampled at a higher rate in an attempt to increase the number of survey completes from these seemingly harder to reach respondents. Likewise, households in the higher response propensity stratum were sampled at a lower rate since a high response is expected from households in those stratum.

After refining the stratified sample to only include households within Reston (Small Tax District 5), a final sample size of 5,346 households were contacted. The table below presents the breakdown of the final sample across the strata, as well as the actual count of households per stratum across all of Reston.

Out of the 5,346 addresses to which mail was sent, 340 addresses (about 6.4%) were identified as bad addresses and returned to CSR by the post office. However, since it is not known whether these addresses were actually unoccupied or non-residential units, we do not exclude these cases from the denominator when computing response rates.

#### **Data Collection**

The survey launched on July 8, 2024 with the mailing of an advance letter to the ABS sample of 5,346 households. The open-access web survey launched on August 5, 2024. Data collection, across all samples and modes, closed on October 10, 2024. The probability data collection followed a confidential protocol to facilitate targeted follow-up to non-respondents. The non-probability data collection followed an anonymous protocol. Greater detail across each mode of data collection is provided below.

#### **Probability Data Collection**

The first contact with the 5,346 households in the ABS sample was the mailed advance letter (signed by RCC Board of Governors Chair Beverly Ann Cosham) on July 8, 2024. This letter was followed by the questionnaire packet, mailed on July 12, 2024. The questionnaire packet included a cover letter (signed by CSR Director Kara Fitzgibbon), questionnaire booklet, foreign language request postcard, and prepaid return envelope. Following the first packet, a thank you/reminder postcard was sent to all valid addresses. The postcard included instructions and a QR code to complete the survey online. This postcard was sent on July 22, 2024.

The second questionnaire packet was mailed to non-respondents on August 23, 2024. The second packet included a modified cover letter that included a short url and unique access code, as well as QR code, to allow participants to complete the survey online. As a final contact, on August 30, non-respondents were sent a closeout postcard that encouraged immediate participation as the survey would soon close. The postcard also included instructions to complete the questionnaire online. Data collection closed on October 10, as paper questionnaires continued to be received throughout September. The full production timeline can be seen below.

CSR managed the tracking of responses and performed data entry for all paper completions. Data entry validation was performed on 15% of submitted questionnaires.

#### Non-probability Data Collection

Data collection for the online open-access survey began on August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024. RCC managed promotion of the non-probability, publicly available survey. Participants could access the public link to complete the questionnaire on the RCC website.

#### **Survey Response**

In total 1,074 responses were collected. This response count includes probability and non-probability cases across both paper and web completions. The specific breakdown is presented in Table 3 below. Probability responses were de-duplicated across the two modes of data collection to ensure only a single response per household was recorded. In instances when a household completed the questionnaire more than once, the most complete and/or first submission was accepted and subsequent entries dropped from the data file.

#### Response Rate

Among the probability sample, 1,034 respondents submitted a usable questionnaire.<sup>1</sup> Following the American Association for Public Opinion Research (AAPOR) disposition codes and response rate calculations,<sup>2</sup> this number of completes yields an estimated response rate (RR3) of 19.3%. Table 4 presents the counts of final dispositions of all households from the probability sample using AAPOR dispositions.

In addition to the 1,034 completions, seven individuals opted-out of the survey. One individual logged into the online survey, but did not answer any questions. One additional, non-duplicate questionnaire was returned to CSR but received after the data collection window had closed. This response is neither included in the final data file/analysis nor the

response rate calculation. Three hundred and forty households in the sample had bad mailing addresses and could not be reached. The mail sent to these 340 households was returned to CSR by the postal service and marked as undeliverable.

#### **Data Preparation**

CSR carried out the data preparation for analysis, which required the labeling, cleaning, and merging of paper and online data across both sample types. While the probability and non-probability data were aggregated, the data were analyzed separately. A comparison of the two sample across all survey questions can be reviewed in Appendix B. All data preparation and analysis was carried out using SPSS.

#### Weighting

As noted, the probability sampling design for the study included stratification across five strata as a means to increase representativeness across Reston. The lower response propensity strata were sampled at a higher rate while the higher response propensity strata were sampled at a lower rate. To produce accurate survey estimates of Reston as a whole, the probability data were weighted so that each household receives a weight inverse to its probability of selection under the specified sampling design. This weighted adjustment that accommodates the effects of the sampling design is known as base weighting, and was applied to the probability sample.

Once the base-weights were applied, an additional step known as post-stratification weighting was performed on the probability data. When surveying the general population, the demographic profile of the survey respondents rarely matches the profile of the population under study. To address this, post-stratification weighting adjusts the survey data to match the population on selected demographics. By doing so, representativeness of the sample data is improved. Further, to the extent that answers to

survey questions are related to the demographic variables included in the weighting, these post-stratification adjustments also reduce biases in survey estimates.

For this study, CSR weighted the probability data on one variable: race by homeownership. This variable contained twelve categories: White homeowner, White renter, African American/Black homeowner, African American/Black renter, Asian homeowner, Asian renter, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander homeowner, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander renter, American Indian/Alaska Native homeowner, American Indian/Pacific Islander renter, Multiracial/Other race homeowner, Multiracial/Other race renter. A statistical method called 'rim weighting' or 'raking' was used to adjust the sample proportions on this variable to closely approximate the population proportions on this same demographic.

Table 5 provides the distribution of cases by race and homeownership across various samples. The first column provides the breakdown of response among the non-probability respondents. The second column provides the breakdown of response among the probability-based responses, unweighted. The third column provides the breakdown of responses among the probability-based responses, after the baseweighting and poststratification weighting have been applied to the data. The final column provides the breakdown for *all* Reston households. These Reston population figures used in weighting and shown in these tables are from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year Estimates (2018-2022).

As can be seen in the table below, renters were under-represented across racial/ethnic affiliations, and White homeowners were over-represented. Post-stratification weighting helped to bring the probability sample in closer alignment to the Reston population on this measure.

#### Demographic Overview

While the post-stratification weighting only incorporated race by homeownership in its statistical process, other demographic proportions within the weighted probability sample were impacted by weighting.

Table 6, presents the distribution of respondents within each sample type and population of Reston across gender, age, marital status, presence of children in the home, Hispanic origin, and language spoken in the home, employment status, household income, and education.

#### **Margin of Error**

The margin of error for the *probability* sample<sup>3</sup> is approximately +/- 3.7 percent at the 95 percent level of confidence. This means that if the survey was repeated with 100 different random samples, the results of the survey would be within 3.7 percentage points of the population mean in 95 out of those 100 iterations of the survey. If there were no other sources of error in the survey besides sampling error, it would also mean that these probability survey results have a 95% chance of being within 3.7 percentage points of the

results that would have been obtained if all households in Reston had been surveyed and all had responded. Note that there are other sources of error in surveys besides sampling error that can be difficult or impossible to measure, these include measurement error (problems with question wording) and non-response bias (differences between those who respond and those who do not).

The margin of error is affected by the weighting of the probability dataset. The estimate of +/- 3.7 percent takes that design effect<sup>4</sup> into account. The margin of error also takes the finite population correction factor (FPC)<sup>5</sup> into account. Note, that every question on the survey has its own margin of error. The overall calculation presented here is for a question answered by all respondents with a 50-50 response distribution. Margins of error would be larger for questions answered by smaller numbers of respondents or for subgroups in the data. On the other hand, questions with a lopsided response pattern (e.g. an 80-20 response pattern) and answered by all respondents will have a smaller margin of error.
