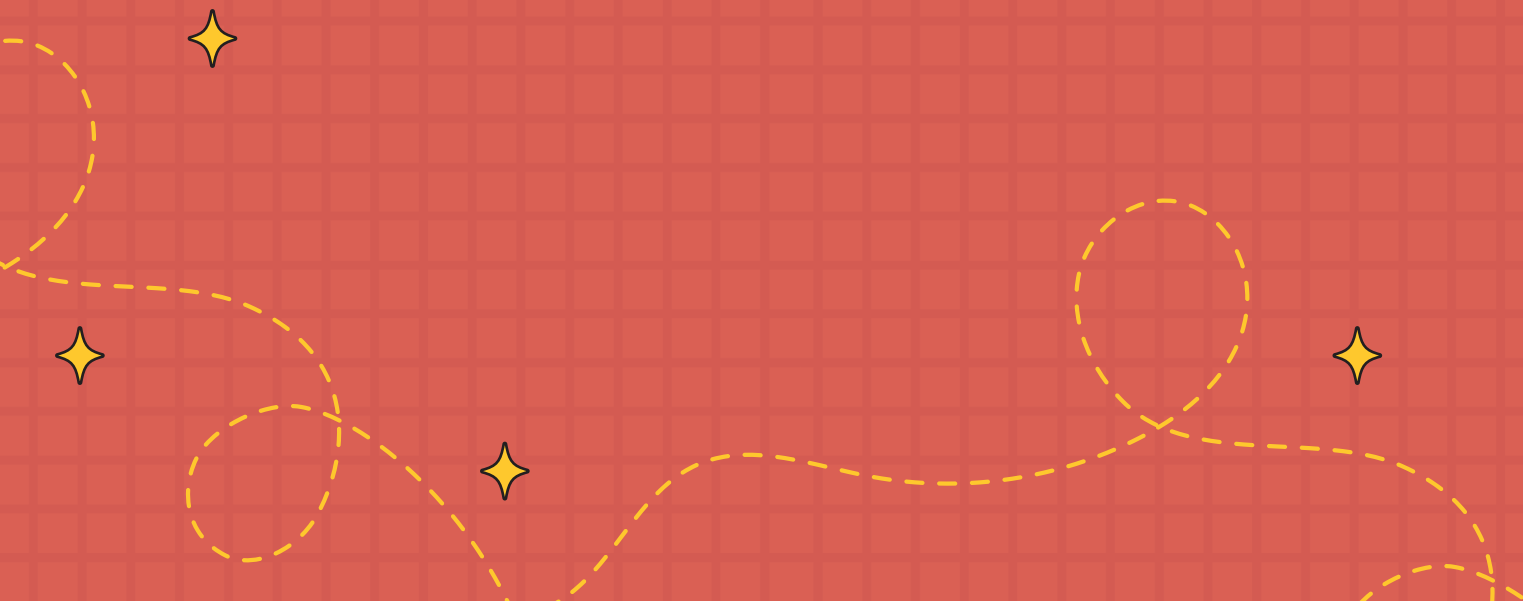

FULL DAY CAMPS

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CAMP GOODTIMES ON THE ROAD

(7 – 11 years old)

Campers will take part in a week of full day field trips to places generally within the Washington, D.C./Baltimore/Richmond metropolitan area. The enriching destinations will include museums, zoos, paintball, skating, boating, ropes courses, swimming and more. Parents/Guardians will be given the specific itinerary in a welcome newsletter approximately one week prior to the start of camp.

Hours: 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Zen Zone, an aftercare program, will be available at RCC Hunters Woods until 5:30 p.m. for a nominal additional fee.

Location: Parents must check in campers at Reston Community Center Hunters Woods each day at 9:00 a.m. They must pick up campers at 4:00 p.m., unless they are registered to participate in Zen Zone; if so, they are to be picked up by 5:30 p.m.

Lunch/Snacks: Campers must bring a bag lunch, drink and two snacks each day, along with a filled water bottle. Please do not pack items that require refrigeration as refrigerated storage is not available.

Camper Gear: Campers must wear their camp T-shirt and rubber wristband (both of which will be provided on the first day of camp) and carry a backpack that supports their bag lunch, snacks, a filled water bottle, and a change of clothes. Campers are also welcome to bring a book. No digital devices, please. RCC is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

Camp Sessions: Swim days are typically on Fridays. Wear a swimsuit under the camp T-shirt and apply sunscreen before camp. Pack a large plastic bag for wet items, towels, goggles and hats. Flip-flops are permitted on swim days only. Some field trip destinations require earlier sign-in and later pickup. Camp registration will be closed on the Thursday prior to the week of camp.

This camp will introduce participants to the skills needed for the American Red Cross Lifeguarding course including communication, teamwork, decision-making and the basic responsibilities of a lifeguard. Junior Lifeguard Camp participants must be able to demonstrate the following skills:

- Swim front crawl for 25 yards continuously while breathing to the front or side.
- Swim backstroke for 25 yards using a pull, breath, kick and glide sequence.
- Maintain position for one minute by treading water or floating.

This camp does not certify participants in lifeguarding or CPR/AED/First Aid.

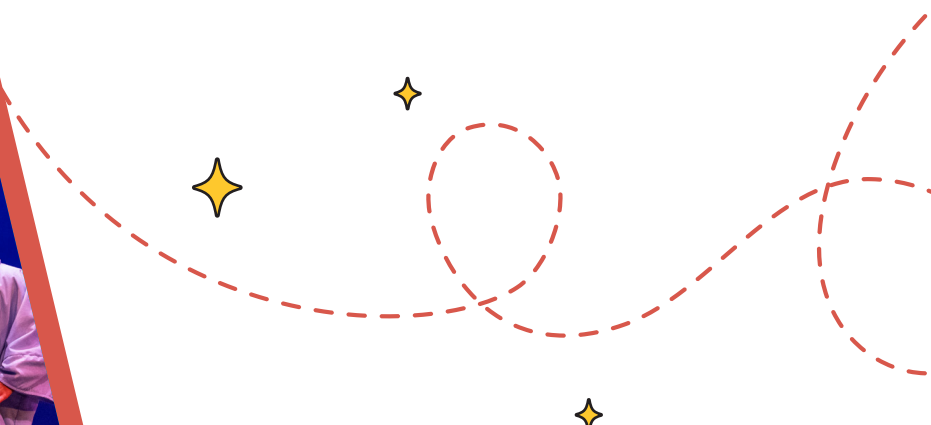

RCC FEE WAIVERS

Reston Community Center provides fee waivers to help eligible residents and employees of Small District 5 participate in RCC programs. This program provides financial assistance to families meeting our income requirements. Completed forms are confidential and will be kept on file for one year. If your family is eligible, a fee waiver account for each family member under age 18 will be created, and may be used for any combination of RCC summer camp programs. The regular Reston resident fee is waived and a \$10 fee is required per week of camp and for each camp registered. The fee is also required for each week of after care programs – Zen Zone and YAT Zen Zone.

Do fee waiver credits expire?

Yes. Fee waiver credits expire on June 30; applications must be made annually.

Does the per household member fee waiver credit include summer camp fee waiver credits?

No. RCC maintains two fee waiver funds, one for “general” programs such as classes, workshops, trips and tours, and a separate fee waiver fund for summer camps. Qualifying individuals will receive an amount each fiscal year that can be applied to general programs. Qualifying summer campers will receive additional fee waiver credits in an amount equal to the total fee for all summer camps for which they successfully register, less a \$10/week non-refundable enrollment fee.

How is eligibility for the Fee Waiver Program determined?

RCC will continue to use an economic means test in order to determine eligibility based upon household income level. The threshold is set at a level higher than 100 percent of the applicable Federal Poverty Level to adjust for the higher cost of living in our area. In addition, only individuals who meet RCC’s definition of a “Reston” patron (either reside or work within Small District 5) are eligible for the Fee Waiver Program.

What documentation is required in order to determine if a member of a household qualifies for the Fee Waiver Program?

Patrons wishing to qualify must show proof of eligibility and documentation describing the household members. Acceptable forms of eligibility and household member documentation include a copy of their latest income tax return, SNAP, TANF, WIC, Medicaid, Head Start and/or Free and Reduced Lunch paperwork.

What if the names of my dependent/foster children are not listed on the income tax return or other documentation provided?

Only those household members listed on the document(s) provided will be eligible to receive the fee waiver credit.

Are there any enrollment fees associated with using the fee waiver credits?

Yes. A \$10.00 non-refundable enrollment fee is required for each week of summer camp.

Can I register online and pay for a program using fee waiver credits?

No, not at this time.

How soon after a fee waiver application form and the supporting documentation is submitted can I register for Camps?

You will be able to submit your registration form immediately or on the first day of Reston registration (whichever is applicable). As long as it is accompanied with the required enrollment fee, the registration will be processed and the seat(s) in the camp(s) will be reserved. Your account will show a balance due until such time as the fee waiver application has been processed and fee waiver payment made.

How long will it take for a fee waiver application to be processed?

Fee waiver applications will be processed by the Customer Relations Director or Assistant Director within three to five days of receipt of the fee waiver application at which time a fee waiver credit will be added to each eligible household member’s account.

But what if it is determined that I am not eligible for a fee waiver?

A member of RCC’s Customer Service staff will contact you and request that the outstanding balance be paid in order to continue to reserve space in the camp. At your discretion, the enrollment may be canceled and the registration fee fully refunded.
