

In July 2016, the Fairfax Board of Supervisors and School Board joined in this resolution and directed the development of a racial and social equity policy for adoption and strategic actions to advance opportunities and achieve equity that include intentional collective leadership, community engagement, equity tools and infrastructure to support and sustain systemic changes, and shared accountability so collectively, we will realize "One Fairfax," a community where everyone can participate and prosper.

RCC Strategic Plan 2021 – 2026 | Equity Pillar

In October 2021, Reston Community Center's Board of Governors adopted a strategic plan for the coming five years. In considering community priorities, the plan established an "Equity Pillar" with the following goal and objectives:

Goal: RCC embodies the principles delineated in the One Fairfax Policy by putting equity at the forefront of meeting community needs, and serves the people and neighborhoods of Reston through allocation of resources according to those needs and informed understanding of the community's diverse interests.
