Did you know camp is a great way to develop community living and service skills? The American Camp Association says camp develops caring, fairness, citizenship and trustworthiness, among many other skills.

## **Camp Goodtimes on the Road** (7 – 11 years old)

This camp treats campers to a full-day field trip generally within the Washington, DC/Baltimore/ Richmond metropolitan area. Campers will be closely supervised by camp staff and will have the opportunity to engage in many enriching experiences over the summer.

**Ages:** Parents must register children by age group, determined by the date of birth as of the first day of camp. The Camp Administrator reserves the right to assign campers to other camp age groups depending on maturity level. Proof of age may be requested.

**Hours:** 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Zen Zone – an after-care program – will be available at RCC Hunters Woods until 5:30 p.m. for a nominal additional fee.

**Camp Sessions:** Camp is organized as five, one-week sessions. Each weekly session will feature a balance of enriching, educational and fun-filled field trips. Camp T-shirts must be worn each day.

There may be occasions when field trip destinations are farther away and require an earlier sign-in and later pick-up. Parents will be notified of any time changes well in advance. 

#### **TIP: Beat the Rush!**

Prior to the start of registration, be sure to log into myRCC with your username and password and check your household information via "My Account." All family members you wish to register must be listed, along with their date of birth. If a family member needs to be added, you must contact RCC Customer Service to do so; patrons may not add or delete household members on their own.

## **RCC** Fee Waivers

Reston Community Center provides fee waivers to help eligible residents and employees of Small District 5 participate in RCC programs. This program provides financial assistance to families meeting our income requirements. Completed forms are confidential and will be kept on file for one year. If your family is eligible, a fee waiver account for each family member under age 18 will be created, and may be used for any combination of RCC summer camp programs. The regular Reston fee is waived and a \$10 fee is required per week of camp and for each camp registered. The fee is also required for each week of after care programs – Zen Zone, YAT Zen Zone and Swim Skills.

#### Do fee waiver credits expire?

Yes. Fee waiver credits expire on June 30; applications must be made annually.

## Does the per household member fee waiver credit include summer camp fee waiver credits?

No. RCC maintains two fee waiver funds, one for "general" programs such as classes, workshops, trips and tours, and a separate fee waiver fund for summer camps. Qualifying individuals will receive an amount each fiscal year that can be applied to general programs. Qualifying summer campers will receive additional fee waiver credits in an amount equal to the total fee for all summer camps for which they successfully register, less a \$10/week non-refundable enrollment fee.

## Can summer camp fee waiver credits be applied to general programs and vice-versa?

No. Summer camp credits can only be applied towards the registration fee for summer camps.

## How is eligibility for the Fee Waiver Program determined?

RCC will continue to use an economic means test in order to determine eligibility based upon household income level. The threshold is set at a level higher than 100 percent of the applicable Federal Poverty Level to adjust for the higher cost of living in our area. In addition, only individuals who meet RCC's definition of a "Reston" patron (either reside or work within Small District 5) are eligible for the Fee Waiver Program. RCC Customer Service Representatives can assist patrons with eligibility questions at either RCC location -Hunters Woods or Lake Anne.

## For purposes of the Fee Waiver Program, what is the definition of a household member?

Household members reside at the same address and are defined as: (i) spouse, (ii) dependent/foster children and (iii) dependent adults.

## What documentation is required in order to determine if a member of a household qualifies for the Fee Waiver Program?

Patrons wishing to qualify must show proof of eligibility and documentation describing the household members. Acceptable forms of eligibility and household member documentation include a copy of their latest income tax return, SNAP, TANF, WIC, Medicaid, Head Start and/or Free and Reduced Lunch paperwork.

## What if the names of my dependent/foster children, spouse or adult dependent are not listed on the income tax return or other documentation provided?

Only those household members listed on the document(s) provided will be eligible to receive the fee waiver credit.

## Are there any enrollment fees associated with using the fee waiver credits?

Yes. A \$5.00 non-refundable enrollment fee is required for each class, trip, Professional Touring Artist Series ticket or RCC pass and a \$10.00 nonrefundable enrollment fee is required for each week of summer camp.

#### I understand that the \$5.00 enrollment fee is nonrefundable, but what about the fee waiver credits used to pay for the registration?

The terms and conditions of RCC's refund/cancellation policy apply to fee waiver payments. Check the Refund information in RCC Program Guides or online at www.restoncommunitycenter.com.

#### How soon after a fee waiver application form and the supporting documentation is submitted can I register for an RCC program?

You will be able to submit your registration form immediately or on the first day of Reston registration (whichever is applicable). As long as it is accompanied with the required enrollment fee, the registration will be processed and the seat(s) in the program(s) will be reserved. Your account will show a balance due until such time as the fee waiver application has been processed and fee waiver payment made.

## How long will it take for a fee waiver application to be processed?

Fee waiver applications will be processed by the Director of Customer Relations within three to five days of receipt of the fee waiver application at which time a fee waiver credit will be added to each eligible household member's account.

#### But what if the Director of Customer Relations determines that I am not eligible for a fee waiver or I do not have sufficient fee waiver credits to offset the program fee?

A member of RCC's Customer Service staff will contact you and request that the outstanding balance be paid in order to continue to reserve space in the class or activity. At your discretion, the enrollment may be canceled and the registration fee fully refunded.

## Can I register online and pay for a program using fee waiver credits?

No. At this time, myRCC – RCC's online registration application – can only process credit card payments (Visa, MasterCard and Discover). You will need to complete and submit a registration form. Registration forms can be found in RCC's Program Guide and are available at all Customer Service counters. RCC partners in the community may also have RCC Program Guides and registration materials. RCC Customer Service staff process Fee Waiver enrollments as rapidly online as patrons when registration opens. You should provide your registration form as soon as possible to assure it is included early in enrollment processes.
